10.1. Appointment of Mayor Pro Tem

Mayor Whitten stated that after April 1 of each year, under the 2018 Charter Changes, the council must elect a Mayor Pro Tem in the unlikely event the Mayor cannot perform his duties, or if there is a time when the Mayor cannot be present at an event or function.

A motion was made by Cynthia Brown to nominate Shannon Hayes to continue as Mayor Pro Tem, seconded by Andrew Rencich, vote 5 yeas and 0 nays, motion carried.

10.2. Request to approve an extension of the contract to purchase Foxwood Estates.

City Manager Tim Bolduc presented an extension Amendment to the contract to purchase Foxwood Country Club. Due to the current circumstances, as well as other factors, they bank has requested an extension to June 29th of this year.

A motion was made by Joe Blocker to Approve the amendment to the purchase contract for Foxwood, seconded by Shannon Hayes, vote 5 yeas and 0 nays, motion carried.

11. City Clerk Report

City Clerk Elizabeth Roy thanked the cities Digital Media Specialist Chance Leavins for his work get the live stream up and running from the City's Website. The meetings tonight have been live on the Website, City of Crestview Facebook, and he and Ken Nielson from CVCTV worked this afternoon to also have the live stream on CVCTV Facebook.

12. City Manager Report

12.1. Creation of Small Business Grant Program

City Manager Tim Bolduc presented to the Council a Plan for a Small Business Assistant Grant. After the presentation, Mr. Bolduc asked for guidance from the council on some of the criteria that would be a part of the process. This would be for businesses that had to shut down through no decision of their own. The funding would come from the Business Tax Receipt funding, which is paid by the businesses in The City of Crestview. The staff plans to and has

reached out to banks in the area for matching funds. Mr. Rencich suggested reaching out to larger businesses also that have not had to shut down during this time.

Mr. LeBoeuf asked for a definition of a small business for this grant. would like it to be spread around to those who do not get other grants.

Would like a report back to the Council, and expressed that caution be exercised so that this would not negatively impacting the City's reserves.

Mr. Rencich Approves of this plan, as these businesses were told by the government to shut down. Feels that restaurants could stay open for to go and curbside and should not be included in this grant, maybe if the CDBG funds become available. He shares the same concerns as Councilman LeBoeuf about reserves, and feels this needs to happen quickly

Mr. Blocker: We need to define what a small business is and bring that back to the council for approval.

Mr. Hayes Agrees with Mr. Hayes and Mr. LeBoeuf, but we need to make these decisions tonight, not wait until the May Meeting.

Ms. Brown feels that the restaurants should be included, since they had very unexpected expenses.

Mayor Whitten stated that the Council need sto define what constitutes a small business tonight, and get the criteria finished so this can start ASAP.

Ms. Brown fees that to define a small business we need to look at the number of employees no minimum She stated we are investing in our own future.

Mr. Bolduc asked the Council to set what the maximum number of employees should be, with no Minimum.

Employee size:

Ms. Brown: No more than 50

Mr. Rencich: Suggests 25 full time

Mr. Hayes: 20 Full time

Mr. Blocker: not to exceed 25

Ms. Brown: 20 - 25 sounds ok

Consensus of Council was to say small business with no more that 25 full time employees.

Discussion was held on the inclusion of restaurants. Consensus from the council was not to include restaurants. Mr. Bolduc suggested that they be included after the initial \$75, 000 with the outside contributions. Council Agreed.

The Criteria that was determined by the Council this evening for a business to be eligible to apply for this grant. :

The business must have 25 or less full time employees as of March 1. 2 20 Hour employees would count as 1 full time.

They must have an active City BTR (Business Tax Receipt)

They must have a Physical Business Location with some sort of store front as of January 1 of this year.

Restaurants not to be included, however, restaurants would be considered with funds that are contributed from outside the City. Restaurant application will be considered after the first \$75,000.

Mr. Bolduc will update council and report at each council meeting
The businesses have to show intention to stay open
This grant would fill in mainly for Utilities and other areas not covered by other grants.

A motion was made by Shannon Hayes to Approve the criteria as presented, seconded by Cynthia Brown, vote 5 yeas and 0 nays, motion carried.

13. Comments from the Mayor and Council

Ms. Brown: No comments

Mr. Blocker state that he also agrees with Mr. LeBoeuf He then asked Mr. Bolduc if he would make a prediction about businesses opening up. Mr. Bolduc stated that in conversations with the Mayor that they City will allow opening with social distancing if the governors pushes it to the Cities or counties. The Governor is expected to make an announcement soon.

Mr. Hayes echoed what the council has said by the staff. He stated that everyone did a great job with the feeding families event on Saturday. Planning was great and the execution was great.


